: Vision and Role of the Qualified Intellectual Disability Professional



Tina Fogarty

Fogarty has more than 25 years of experience in the human services field, 22 of which were spent at Neumann Family Services. As Neumann's Vice President of Programs and Services, Fogarty worked to develop, implement and lead a wide range of residential, adult learning, employment, clinical and case management programs.

Fogarty has extensive experience working with people who have a dual diagnosis of a developmental disability and a mental illness. She also served young adults with a dual diagnosis who were transitioning to community-integrated living arrangements, also known as group homes, after receiving services from the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services.

Keynote Speech II : Occupation-based Practice (OBP): A New Trend in Japan Based on OT History and Professional Identity Crisis



Hiromi Nakamura-Thomas

Hiromi Nakamura-Thomas, PhD., OTR/L (Japan), is Professor at Graduate School of Health, Medicine and Welfare, Professor at Department of Occupational Therapy, School of Health, Medicine and Welfare, Saitama Prefectural University in Japan.

She contributed a case study (AKIRA, page 251) for the Model of Human Occupation, 5th edition & one of the co-authors of the book, chapter 16. Her original papers addressed the Japanese Interest Checklist for the Elderly (JICE) which were published in the BJOT: 2011, 2012, 2014 and 2016. An original paper addressed the Occupational Self Assessment (OSA) for older adults was published in PT & OT Geriatrics in 2013. Her MOHO relevant occupational therapy practices for community-dwelling older adults have been administered for 8 years since 2011 by obtaining governmental grants in Japan.

Dr. Nakamura currently performs an editorial board member of the British Journal of Occupational Therapy(BJOT), reviewer roles in occupational therapy national journals, and guest speaker roles to provide Model of Human Occupation(MOHO) based lectures for OT students in European OT programs. She is interested in clients' perspectives, thus, her international projects with Kent University, UK, are establishing the Japanese version of Adult Social Care Outcome Toolkits (ASCOT) and its caregiver version to measure quality of Life (QoL) among adults, requiring social care services, and their caregivers for sustaining their community life.





Keynote Speech III : Equal Access to the Built Environment – Beyond Disability, the Universal Design Approach



Arc. Joseph Kwan Architect and Accessibility Consultant Pioneer, Advocate, Educator, Social Architect on equality and architecture

JOSEPH KWAN received his architectural training at the Queensland Institute of Technology (1976) Australia, and later obtained a M.Sc. in Environmental Psychology from the University of Surrey (1979) United Kingdom. He has more than 40 years of experience in international architectural practice having worked in Australia, United Kingdom, and France, and now over 30 years in Hong Kong.

He has been the Director of a Hong Kong NGO specializing in accessible built environments for 18 years with the objective of making Hong Kong more accessible for the elderly and people with disabilities, in particular to the built environment and public transportation. During this period, he participated in the drafting of the *Design Manual – Barrier Free Access 1997* and the *2008* version. Currently, he is a Member of the ISO Standard WG on the review of *ISO 21542: Accessibility and Usability of the Built Environment 2011*.

He is the Founding Director of **UDA Consultants Ltd**. (*Universal Design and Accessibility Consultants*) in Hong Kong since 2005. He is a Past Vice-President of Hong Kong Institute of Architects, the current Vice-Chair of Architects Registration Board Hong Kong, a past UIA Council Member and Inaugural Chairman of ARCASIA Committee on Social Responsibility, the current Director of UIA WP on *Architecture for All* and **Deputy Vice-President Asia Pacific for Rehabilitation International.**

He has lectured on accessibility and universal design in over 30 countries, and is the advisor/consultant to ADB, UN-ESCAP and World Bank on accessible transportation, built environment and inclusive tourism. In Hong Kong, he is a Member of the Labour and Welfare Bureau's Rehabilitation Advisory Committee (RAC), and the Convenor of RAC Sub-committee on Access.









Keynote Speech IV : Building Relationships through Experiential Learning



Bit Na Kim

Four-time Outstanding Professor Award recipient, **Bit Na Kim** is an assistant professor in the Department of Creative Integrated Studies. She serves on the English staff hiring committee and is a judge at the annual Daegu University Global Lounge Speech Contest. She is the creator of the DU Speech Club which is open to students interested in improving their English skills.

A volunteer at K-Pace since 2013, she has taken a more active role in the past two years. She is in charge of coordinating volunteers from the English faculty and is responsible for the weekly classes with the K-Pace students.







Keynote Speech V Physical Therapy Education and Practice in the Philippines: Challenges and Opportunities



Reynaldo D. Ramos

Prof. REYNALDO D. RAMOS is a physical therapist and presently employed as a full time assistant professor at Daegu University. He was born on January 26, 1976 to a family of teachers. He earned a bachelor's degree in Physical Therapy (PT) at Silliman University, and his master's degree in Rehabilitation Science at the University of the Philippines.

He was a clinical instructor in three PT training centers in the Philippines and closely supervised PT students in these centers. As a professor, he taught three to five PT major subjects per week and prepared PT Laboratory Manuals for the academic education program.

His research interest is in the area of musculoskeletal disorder rehabilitation and prevention. He likes to interact with patients, students, and practitioners, and works in an academic institution that develops students who are responsible, accountable, ethically sound, competitive, and capable in becoming a major mover in their community.
